### The Importance of Edges

Improve your paintings and create more interest with the use of different edges, hard, soft, semisoft, broken, and varied lengths, and widths.

Each edge helps to tell the story. They denote the hardness or softness of an object, such as a rock or building, versus a tree-top or a cloud.

Since the eye focuses on hard edges, they may be used to move the viewer around the painting and direct you to the focal point.

Generally, the focal point will have the most detail, contrast and hardest edges. By softening surrounding edges, it encourages the eye to "move on" and travel to the areas that are more detailed and most important.

Experiment with edges for dynamic results.
